

What is Clinical Pastoral Education?

Clinical Pastoral Education teaches graduate-level theological students and religious leaders from diverse faiths the art of spiritual care through direct encounter with individuals in crisis.

Participants are invited to reflect upon their experiences with supervisors and peers in order to deepen personal and professional awareness.

CPE serves as preparation for parish ministry, professional chaplaincy, or counseling. Many graduate-level theological programs consider a unit of CPE a core requirement for graduation. Similarly, CPE is often necessary for individuals seeking ordination.

Individuals are considered for acceptance into a CPE program based upon their written application and an on-site interview. Typically, applicants have completed at least one year of graduate-level theological education.

Program Structure

- Friends Hospital offers a 9-month extended unit of Level I CPE running from September through May.
- Students complete approximately 300 hours of direct client care in addition to 100 hours of education facilitated by an ACPE-accredited supervisor.
- Education hours and group processing time are scheduled from 8:00am—12:00pm on Thursdays through the academic year. Clinical time will be scheduled through the supervisor in accordance with the student's needs.

Program Components

Clinical Seminars

Students present and reflect upon their firsthand accounts of pastoral encounter with peers and invite critical feedback.

Interpersonal Relations Seminars (IPR)

An open-ended group process experience designed to promote personal and professional growth. IPR invites students to experience a great range of emotional, intellectual and theological perspectives through peer engagement.

Didactic Seminars

Sessions include lectures and presentations on topics related to pastoral practice, theology, and mental health care from a diverse community of experts in pastoral and related fields.

Book Seminars

Students read and present on classic works in pastoral theology and spiritual care. Reading material is chosen based on student interest, backgrounds, and experiences.

Individual Supervision

Students receive supervision from an ACPE-accredited supervisor. Supervision sessions occur regularly throughout the unit.

Program Requirements

- Students serve as staff chaplains, providing spiritual care to individuals with a variety of mental health needs
- CPE students complete 4 hours of education and 8 hours of direct patient care per week. Weekend and holiday coverage is rotated. No overnight hours are required in this setting
- In addition to direct client care, students complete a variety of writing assignments
- Participants in the CPE program complete the hospital orientation and a criminal background check
- A \$550 tuition payment is required for the unit which includes a \$100 deposit made upon acceptance into the program
