
Couples and Family Therapy/Counseling 2nd Year Residency Position: September, 2015 – August, 2016

The resident in this program will develop competency in and have significant exposure to offering spiritual care for veterans, families, and couples from a variety of patient populations which will include both individual and group counseling/therapy.

Qualified applicants will have successfully completed a CPE Residency and will have successfully met, or will be ready to meet, a consultative committee for moving to Level 2 CPE Outcomes, which will be the foci of these 2nd year residency positions.
