A former journalist, Carlos received an MS degree from Columbia University's Graduate School of Journalism and a Master of Divinity degree from NY Theological Seminary. He is ordained by the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), and lectures on Afro-Caribbean Spirituality and Pastoral Care, Spirituality and Trauma, and on Cultural Issues in End-of-Life Care.

Reverend Eddie Lopez, Director, Spiritual Care Department/Supervisory Candidate Eddie joined the Spiritual Care Staff at Greenwich Hospital as Director in 2009.
