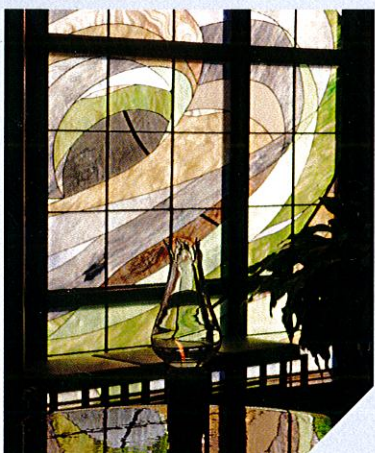

Clinical Pastoral Education Residency



Program Description

Mayo School of Health Sciences (MSHS) offers a 12-month intensive ACPE Accredited Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) Residency program at Mayo Clinic's campus in Rochester, Minnesota. A hospital chaplain uses the insights and principles of psychology, religion, spirituality and theology in working with individuals, couples, families and groups to achieve wholeness and health. A chaplain, lay or ordained, provides spiritual support and pastoral care to patients and their families. All chaplains are willing to support and encourage people of all religious faiths.

The CPE Residency Program provides three units of clinical pastoral training. Each unit is approximately 13 weeks long, with a one-month break between units. Each unit provides at least 400 hours of supervised clinical education and fulfills all the necessary accreditation standards.

Program Requirements

Each year, MSHS admits three students to the CPE Residency program in Rochester, Minnesota. To be eligible to apply for the Clinical Pastoral Education Residency Program one unit of CPE is preferred. In addition, you must also:

- Have a bachelor's degree plus some graduate level theological/religious education is required. Masters of Divinity, Theology or Pastoral Care preferred. Members in a religious order may also be considered.
- Show motivation for clinical pastoral education and show a desire to engage in professional chaplaincy
- Demonstrate the potential for advanced training
- Have clearly defined educational objectives for the experience
- Have faith group endorsement

Curriculum

The CPE residency offers you:

- Daily small group participation and learning
- Weekly individual supervision
- Daily opportunities for pastoral ministry on patient units as well as on-call crisis experiences
- Daily opportunities for interdisciplinary dialogue and collaboration



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CPE residents participate in daily educational groups several days a week and have most of the remaining time to serve as the primary chaplain on an inpatient or outpatient unit. Reflection on clinical experiences helps residents develop and increase their pastoral assessment skills, their listening and responding skills, and their competence in delivering pastoral interventions and strategies. Experienced staff chaplains and other members of the interdisciplinary healing team provide opportunities for mentoring and collaboration.

Clinical Rotations

Residents complete a variety of clinical specialty rotations in order to broaden their experience and receive exposure to diverse medical and spiritual issues. Clinical experiences may include: cardiology, intensive care units, long-term rehabilitation, neurology, pediatrics, surgery, gynecology, hematology, hospice, oncology, transplantation and psychiatry.

Certification

Upon successful completion of the Clinical Pastoral Education Residency, you receive a certificate of completion from Mayo School of Health Sciences and will be eligible to seek career positions in the field of chaplaincy.
