What is Clinical Pastoral Education?

Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) is clinical training and experiential theological education designed to improve the quality of pastoral care offered by spiritual caregivers of all faiths and levels of experience. Our program uses a reflection-action model of learning that integrates components of direct spiritual care, personal and theological reflection, supervision, peer review and supportive group process. As a student in our program, you will become a part of an interdisciplinary care team that serves our diverse population of residents and their loved ones. This direct service facilitates the application of learned theory and your own personal and pastoral and personal experiences as you minister to residents, families, and staff.

How can CPE benefit you?

Through CPE, you will gain clinical skills that are applicable to any ministerial setting. After completion of four units, you will also be eligible to apply for board certification with the National Association of Catholic Chaplains or other faith certifying associations. Other placements within the ArchCare system may be available. ACPE-CPE training is recognized as a standard for chaplaincy world-wide.

CPE PROGRAMS OFFERED

ArchCare is accredited by ACPE as a satellite of Calvary Hospital to offer Level I and II, and Supervisory Education. One unit of CPE is 400 hours: 300 are direct ministry on assigned resident units or with group programs. Weekday & weekend shifts are available. The remaining 100 hours include instructional and peer group processing. We offer a full-time, Level I and II summer unit from May 2018 through July 2018.
