





What is CPE?

Michigan Medicine uses a clinical method of learning, focused on data from the actual practice of ministry as the content for reflection.

Clinical Pastoral Education is an interfaith professional education for ministry. From theological reflection on clinical situations, students gain a new understanding of ministry. Educators and adjunct faculty employ the clinical method of learning ministry guided by nationally accredited standards developed by ACPE: The Standard for Spiritual Care & Education and endorsed by The U.S. Department of Education.

Out of intense involvement with patients, families, and staff, CPE students gain greater awareness to the spiritual needs of those to crisis.

Level I and II Programs

Our ACPE Certified Educators and adjunct faculty seek to provide engaging training and experiences, primarily through dialogue, discovery, use of skills, and extensive clinical practice of ministry. A central focus is aimed at exploring individual aspects of heritage, knowledge, personal characteristics, and theology so that learners will be able to

integrate clinical education into further development as spiritual care provider.

CPE Programs at Michigan Medicine are a structured system of components in which clinical pastoral learning can occur in a variety of settings. Programs are augmented with higher education technology used at all levels of education at The University of Michigan.

- Internship Level I / II
- 16-week programs, based upon unit level, featuring training beginning in the Spring, Fall or Winter seasons.
- Opportunity to work with a mentor who has been oriented to the standard outcomes for CPE students.
- Residency Level I / II
- 12-month programs, based upon unit level, beginning in annually in the Fall or Winter seasons.
- Opportunity for development of pastoral competence within an identified focus area available within the many Michigan Medicine specialty teams and clinics.
- Benefits include a \$30,000 annual living stipend and access to medical benefits.
- Training in a diverse setting within modern medical facilities.
