



CPE Residency Position in Intersectional LGBTQ Advocacy Available Now

Hebrew SeniorLife in Boston is offering a single CPE residency position focusing on LGBTQ elders and communities of color. Funded by the Carpenter Foundation, the student will do three units of CPE. Their clinical work will include LGBTQ education, advocacy, and support across the Hebrew SeniorLife system and in the community, in addition to traditional chaplaincy on an assigned HSL housing campus or medical unit. This position builds on the work of three previous LGBTQ residents in the HSL CPE program, and adds to this scope with HSL's forthcoming expansion into Boston's African American community.

Start date: As soon as possible, and at least by late May in order to do Summer 21 CPE

Hours: Full-time

March – May: Clinical placement, and LGBTQ advocacy and community work.

CPE units: Summer 2021, Extended 21-22, Summer 2022

Prerequisites: At least 1 unit of ACPE CPE. Prior experience with African American communities and LGBTQ communities. Prior experience with older adults preferred.

Stipend: \$40,000 annually with access to HSL employee benefits. Funding for six months is in-hand. Funding for the remaining 12 months is pending.
