- Class meets by video conference on Tuesdays, 2:00 to 7:00 PM.
 First and last days of the program are 9:00 to 5:00 at TCC.
- Clinical rotation is 15 hours per week

Students participate in an on-line, interactive CPE unit (5 hrs. per week) that requires written and video participation for class and individual sessions. There is also 15 hours per week of clinical visitation time. Students will be expected to visit patients in person at TCC or at a facility served by ArchCare.

There is \$800 fee for participation in the program. No charge for apostolate priests.

ACPE-CPE Programs offered

ArchCare is accredited by ACPE as a satellite of Calvary Hospital to offer Level I and II. One unit of CPE is 400 hours: 300 are direct ministry on assigned resident units or with group programs. Weekday and weekend shifts are available. The remaining 100 hours include instructional and peer group processing.

CPE students join interdisciplinary teams and provide multi-faith religious/spiritual care to diverse inpatient/outpatient patients and their loved ones. This direct service facilitates the application of learned theory/academia and personal/pastoral experiences as students' minister to patients, families and staff.

Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) is experiential theological education designed to improve the quality of pastoral care offered by spiritual caregivers of all faiths and levels of experience. Our programs use a reflective practice model of learning that integrates components of direct spiritual care, personal and theological reflection, clinical supervision, peer review and supportive group process.

Our admission policy accepts candidates on a rolling basis. Admission is closed once the class is filled. Application deadline is September 15, 2021.
